Easter 2016 - Corran

This year Easter is an early one, with Easter Saturday on March 27th.

I've reserved accommodation from Saturday 26th March to Saturday 2nd April 2016 in Ardgour / Corran immediately over the Corran Ferry from the Fort William road north of the Balachulish bridge. Please note that this is the traditional Easter week (i.e. it is the week including Easter Sunday).

The ferry is fairly expensive at £8 per car+ passengers, per crossing (no return tickets, no prebooking). An alternative route to Fort William is up the west side of Loch Linnhe to Glenfinnan which adds about 25 miles to the journey (probably 30 minutes net). There is however lots to do without leaving the west side of Linnhe.

The accommodation this year is in three houses. I estimate the cost to be between £205 and £245 per person for the week depending on how numbers fit the houses. As usual I have paid out deposits to secure these houses and I will need to pay the balances before February 15th 2016

I need confirmation of numbers as soon as possible since I am concerned that if numbers fall short of my guess, I may need to release one of the houses.






Beinn Odhar Bheag – across Loch Sheil. Corbett. May be shortest ascent from Glenfinnan though a tricky approach

Mull & Iona



A Calmac ferry runs every day from Kilchoan on Morvern except Sunday to Tobermory with the winter timetable showing crossings starting at 8am.(£16.80 + £5.30 per passenger, return). A drive to Iona takes about 1 hour.

Boat trip – Staffa & Fingals Cave Wildlife Tour



Departs from Kilchoan (or alternatively Tobermory). The trip lasts 5 hours. Possible sightings of White Tailed Eagles a with 1 hour on Staffa at the cave. £45 per head. (I've called to check they will be running)

Accommodation Ardgour House

This magnificent Georgian building is located in more than 6 acres of wonderful parkland and with mountains and sea very close by. Ardgour House comfortably sleeps 22 people and there is plenty of public space as well with spacious sitting room, dining room for 22, billiard room and chidren's play room to spread out. Perhaps the 'piece de resistance' is the fantastic indoor swimming pool. There is also a sauna, so there is much fun to be had for young and old in this great house no matter what the weather.

The house nestles under the magnificent mountains of the Ardgour Peninsula and is perfectly located to allow you to explore the wild landscape of Scotland and its lochs and the shortest route to the house is over the Coran Ferry crossing Loch Linney (approximately a five minute crossing). The house, with wheelchair access, is superb for family gatherings and parties providing substantial accommodation so that you are not living on top of each other.


Special features of the house are the billiard room with full sized snooker table together with the indoor swimming pool (5m x 10m) together with sauna. The house is large enough to also accommodate a games room with full sized table tennis table. The large dining room provides seating for twenty two guests and is perfect for those special occasions. The house is suitable for those with limited mobility as there is a twin bedroom and bathroom on the ground floor. The house retains its character in being the former seat of the MacLeans and there are many pictures and also a family tree in the study of the house. The house is furnished to match its character and proves to be popular with those who visit it though it is not a luxurious house but rather provides clean, comfortable but modestly furnished and spacious rooms.

Ardgour has a great history - former seat of the MacLeans the history can be traced back for 600 years and many family paintings remain today. There are still many original features in the house – wonderful wooden doors, stone flagged corridors and wonderful shuttered windows for example.

Lighthouse Lodge

The Lodge is converted from the original lighthouse keepers' cottages into luxurious self catering holiday accommodation providing 5 double or twin en-suite bedrooms, a large elegant lounge with wood burning stove and a charming country kitchen. Rooms are spacious, light and airy. The large private walled garden is perfect for barbecues and has direct access to the beach. There are excellent amenities in the village of Ardgour and nearby Fort William.

A working Lighthouse, Corran Lighthouse was built in 1860 by Thomas and David Stevenson, father and uncle to Robert Louis Stevenson. The Lighthouse is still working, albeit without the fog horn and is operated by the Northern Lighthouse Board.
